School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2016-17 educational progress for Delton Kellogg Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given a label.

Delton Kellogg Elementary School has shown a decrease in proficiency levels as measure by the M-STEP in both Math and Reading. We are also scoring below the state average on both of these tests. Our building school improvement team has closely examine these results and our curriculum in an effort to reverse this trend.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Delton Kellogg Elementary School serves all students in grades pre-school – 4th grades. Parents are provided the opportunity annually to give input into the selection of the next year's teacher.
2. The DKES School Improvement Plan was updated in 2016-2017 for improvement in the core academic areas and in implementing technology

- for each student across all grade levels. It was filed with the Michigan Department of Education.
3. Delton Kellogg Schools have one Elementary School. DKES is for grades Pre School – 4th grade.
 4. Delton Kellogg Elementary School is in the process of reviewing and revising our core curriculum and updating it to reflect best research based instructional practices. A copy of the core curriculum, a description of its implementation and how it may vary from the state’s model is available by contacting the school office.
 5. Delton Kellogg Elementary School uses the following local data: DIBELs (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills), Fountas and Pinnell, Writing Rubrics, AVR M Math Screeners, Everyday Math Assessments, i-Ready (On-line testing) and the State of Michigan’s State Wide Assessment Program. Our local data is demonstrating that our student’s proficiency is improving in the areas of Reading and Math. As a building, we were performing similar to the State of Michigan on the MEAP tests, but performed below the State on the new MSTEP.
 6. Parent Teacher conferences were attended at a rate of 97% in the fall and 88% in the spring for 2016-2017 and 96% in the fall and 94%% in the spring for 2017-2018 school year. (* Low attendance due to bad weather)

Delton Kellogg Elementary School is continually working on increasing our student success through curriculum and instructional improvement, integrating technology, and social and emotional growth. This is all possible due to our great partnership with our community members, parents, and fine teaching staff. At Delton Kellogg Elementary School we are SK2R! (Safe, Kind, Respectful and Responsible).
